



HEDIS Tip of the Week – March 15, 2023

HEDIS has specific rules for the member to be compliant for Rotavirus vaccine. The vaccine must be administered between 42 days (6 weeks) after birth and 2nd birthday. Doses administered prior the 42nd day or after the 2nd birthday **do not count** toward HEDIS compliance.

There are 2 different types of Rotavirus vaccine. There is a 2-dose version and a 3-dose version.

Any of the following would count for HEDIS:

- 2 doses of the 2-dose version administered on different dates of service at least 14 days apart.
- 3 doses of the 3-dose version administered on different dates of service at least 14 days apart.
- 1 dose of the 2-dose version + 2 doses of the 3-dose version administered on different dates of service at least 14 days apart.

Billing Tips

Please bill for the appropriate vaccine CPT code on the claim, and not just the CPT code for administration of vaccine, even if you are a VFC provider.

If you are a VFC provider, CFMG cannot pay you for the vaccine CPT but will for the administration of the vaccine. However, the CPT on the claim will let us know that the specific vaccine was administered.

- CPT for 2-dose version: 90681
- CPT for 3-dose version: 90680

Medical Record Tips

Please document the type of Rotavirus vaccine administered and the date of service.

If the medical record just indicates “Rotavirus” or “RV”, HEDIS requires us to assume that the 3-dose version was administered.

HEDIS will allow any of the following to distinguish between the 2-dose and 3-dose versions.

Type of Information	2-Dose Version	3-Dose Version
Brand Name	Rotarix	Rotateq
Manufacturer	GSK (GlaxoSmithKline) or SKB (SmithKline Beecham)	Merck or MSD
Other acceptable documentation	Monovalent RV1 RV2 Rotavirus 2-dose version	Pentavalent RV5 Rotavirus 3-dose version



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Other Tips

Please document promptly bill for the vaccine and vaccine administration and document the vaccine in CAIR. In addition to making sure you receive HEDIS credit for administration of the vaccine, we want to assure providers in the ED and inpatient setting, that the recommended vaccine regimen has or has not been completed.

If you do not document evidence of vaccine administration via claims data or via CAIR data, the Health Plan may request medical records from your office for HEDIS purposes.
